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IRISH PHOTOGRAPHIC FEDERATION DIGITAL AUDIO VISUAL NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES & CONDITIONS of ENTRY Updated, April, 2018.

<u>Conditions of Entry</u>: Except where provided in these rules the decision of the organisers shall be final and binding. Submission of an entry implies that the entrant has read and accepted the following in all respects

The National Competition:

Anyone who wishes to submit Sequences to the IPF National Championships are required to be a paid up member of an IPF affiliated camera club and the IPF Audio-Visual Group.

Members of the AV Group Committee are allowed to submit Sequences at the IPF National Championships

Categories

Novice: Beginners section.

• Intermediate: Authors advancing from the Novice Section and holders of an L.I.P.F in Audio Visual.

• **Advanced:** Authors advancing from Intermediate or Authors holding an I.P.F., (above L.I.P.F.) or equivalent AV Distinction, or have won Best Overall Trophy, or 1st prize in an AV competition.

• **Club:** The Andorra Trophy is awarded to the winner of this category, which involves a minimum of 3 members from a club/society.

• **Humorous:** The Hemmingway Trophy will be awarded for the best humorous sequence in any category.

In addition to the Awards for the Categories above there are special awards for **Best Overall Sequence**; **Best Sound**; **Best Photography**; **Best Script**; and **Best First Time Entry**, which will be awarded over all categories.

<u>Promotion:</u> a Point System will be used to allow IPF AV Group members to get promoted from the <u>Novice to Intermediate</u> <u>Section</u> and from <u>Intermediate Section to Advanced.</u>

New entrants may voluntary enter the Intermediate or Advanced Section but cannot revert to a lower section.

The points will be awarded for the following achievements:

- 4 Points will be awarded for 1st. Place
- 2 Points will be awarded for 2nd. Place
- 1 Point will be awarded for 3rd. Place
- 1 Point will be awarded for an Honourable Mention.
- 1 Point will be awarded for winning best first time entry in Novice.

Points gained in each year of entry will be added together until the total of 4 points is reached and promotion to next level is then achieved. The Secretary will keep an updated record of the points awarded to members and each member will be notified of their current points total at the start of each year.

As is always the case where there are fewer entries than the total number of awards the judges will use their discretion on whether to make an award and at that level.

Duration: No sequence may exceed twelve-minute duration.

<u>Authorship</u>: For all sequences it is expected that the sequence production will be the original work of the entrant(s), (author(s)) and collaborators. "Collaborators need not be Club members, nor affiliated to the I.P.F."

Copyright & Responsibility: Entrants using copyright material must obtain the necessary licence or permission. Submission of an entry implies the granting of permission for the sequence to be shown in public. Entrants must have a Copyright Performance Licence. Paid up members of the IPF AV Group are included in a group licence and hold an IPF AV Group Copyright performance licence. The Mechanical-Copyright Protection Society Ireland Ltd., (MCPS) Licence, grants permission to use music and sound only. In accordance with the established music and image copyright regulations, sequences presented at the Championships should be free of all rights of ownership, artistic or otherwise, which others may hold. By participating in the Championships author/s of AV sequences indemnify the organisers against all and any action that may be taken against them by owners of copyrights. The organisers will accept no responsibility in the case of dispute or litigation. All care will be taken in the handling of sequences, but the organisers cannot accept responsibility for loss, theft or damage.



<u>A New Open Photo Harmony Competition</u> will be run in conjunction with the IPF National AV Competition, which will be open to all irrespective of member ship of the IPF. A Plaque will be awarded for the Best Overall entry; Medals will be awarded to the two runners up and Best Irish entry. Certificates will be awarded at the judge's discretion. There are no categories in this competition.

Photo Harmony is intended to demonstrate skill in the production and visual progression of still images linked to sound. No words or story with a specific beginning, middle and ending are required. The emphasis is on matching the images with appropriate transitions and harmonising them with the sound. Video clips are not allowed in the sequence. The aim is to construct a sequence so that images progress harmoniously in terms of colour, tone and graphic design and that they also harmonise with the sound chosen. It is recommended that the sound and the images start and finish together and that the original ending of the music is preserved rather than an arbitrary fade-out.

The Rules for Photo Harmony Competition are as follows:

- 1. This competition is a "slide show" of still images on a theme set to music, <u>video is not allowed</u>. Text can to be used within the sequence but its use is discouraged.
- 2. Entries to be executable files as produced by Pictures To Exe; Pro show Gold or an mpg4 file. (Other software or formats by prior approval).
- 3. All photographers must be credited, either at the beginning or the end of the sequence and all images must be the original work of the photographers credited.
- 4. The minimum length will be 3 minutes and the maximum length 5 minutes. The length of the sequence, including all titles and credits, is to be between 180 seconds and 300 seconds.
- 5. The opening sequence is to include the title of the show.
- 6. The entry fee is €15.00. This entry fee allows the author(s) to submit a maximum of two sequences.

<u>Judging for both competitions:</u> One or more qualified person(s) will judge. They should be well known in Audio-Visual or a similar media. All entries will be shown at the National Championships. Judge(s) are not permitted to be entrants and his/her/their decision/s (*regarding the results of the competition*) is final.

<u>Audience Vote:</u> The audience can vote for their preferred best sequence in both competitions. This is independent of the official judging.

Technical Requirements: A digital projector, computer (Windows Operating System platform) and sound system will be provided. Entries may be submitted electronically by file transfer protocol (FTP) "WeTransfer.com" or by CD/DVD. All submitted entries shall be self-executable files (exe or mpeg4) named with the Sequences title*. All sequences should be standalone files and must run with no additional software requirements. Each sequence must run without software promotion slides and in full screen format. The sequence should be programmed with no 'run box', and to return to the desktop at the end. If a sequence does not meet these requirements then the work will be rejected from the competition. All entries should contain a folder for each slideshow clearly labelled and also include a copy of the entry/identification form. All CD/DVD's should be indelibly labelled. The sequence file and all other material should bear the name of the sequence as printed on the entry/identification form. All sequences will be copied to the Hard Drive for projection at the National Championships

In the National Championships Competition, no sequence should display music credits or Logos and the Authors' names must not appear on sequences.

Copied material (sequences) will be archived following the Festival and the CD returned, unless other arrangements have been made with the author. Those not wishing to have their work archived, may apply an expiry date to the file sent or tick the box on entry form re permission to archive. Author's permission will be sought for any showing of archival material for use of promoting AV. The right to grant or refuse permission for showing rests with the named Author.

<u>Entry Form and Fees for both competitions:</u> Every sequence submitted requires a separate Entry Form, forms should be sent together with sequence entry fee to: The AV Secretary, **Lilian Webb**, **A.I.P.F.**, 66 Roseville, Naas, Co. Kildare (ipfavgroup@gmail.com) and shall arrive not later than 14th September 2018.

The National Competition A fee of €15.00 is payable for up to a maximum of 2 sequences by the same author.

The Open Photo Harmony Competition A fee of €15.00 is payable for up to a maximum of 2 sequences by the same author.

Sequence material/Identification Sheets for both competitions:

All Identification sheets and sequences should be sent, by electronic transfer to **alanpsi@eircom.net** or, by post to: Alan Lyons, A.I.P.F., Technical Team, 32 Oatfield Avenue, Clondalkin, Dublin 22; Entries shall arrive **not later than Friday 28th. September, 2018.**

Return of Entries: Every care will be taken in the handling of CD entries but the organisers cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage however caused. Preferably all entries should be collected from the organisers at the end of the Championships. Please enclose return postage if sequences are to be returned.

IPF AV Distinctions:

Sequences submitted for distinctions CANNOT be entered in the IPF National AV Championships in the same year as the application for the distinction.

All the above rules re technical requirements also apply. Members of the committee, who are distinction holders, are available for mentoring before applications are made. Closing date for application for distinctions is Friday 7th September - application forms are available on www.irishphoto.ie together with an IPF handbook on how to apply for each type of distinction. A sequence or sequences of no less than 8 minutes is required for LIPF application, no less than 12 minutes for AIPF application and no less than 20 minutes for FIPF application.
