(01-6263658). **No sequences can be accepted after this date.** 

**Note:** Sequences should not have been entered in previous I.P.F. AV National Championships. The Author may enter in a category of his/her choice; providing they meet the requirements (see rules). All national entries will be judged and commented on.

## IRISH PHOTOGRAPHIC FEDERATION DIGITAL AUDIO VISUAL NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES & CONDITIONS of ENTRY Updated, June, 2014.

<u>Conditions of Entry</u>: Except where provided in these rules the decision of the organisers shall be final and binding. Submission of an entry implies that the entrant has read and accepted the foregoing in all respects

<u>The National Competition:</u> The Championships are open to all members of the IPF Audio-Visual Group (including members of the AV Group Committee) who wish to submit Sequences.

<u>The All Ireland Section</u> is open to all and all National entries will be included unless declared otherwise. Sequences shown in previous championships and previous winners excluded.

#### **Categories:**

- Novice: Beginners section.
- Intermediate: Authors advancing from the Novice Section and holders of an L.I.P.F.
- Advanced: Authors advancing from Intermediate or Authors holding an I.P.F., (above L.I.P.F.) or equivalent AV Distinction, or have won Best Overall Trophy, or 1<sup>st</sup> prize in an AV competition.
- **Club:** The Andorra Trophy is awarded to the winner of this category, which involves a minimum of 5 members from a club/society.
- Humorous: The Hemmingway Trophy will be awarded for the best humorous sequence in any category.

**Promotion:** Starting at this year Championships a Point System will be used to allow IPF AV Group members to get promoted from the <u>Novice to Intermediate Section</u> and from <u>Intermediate Section to Advanced</u>.

New entrants may voluntary enter the Intermediate or Advanced Section but cannot revert to a lower section. The points will be awarded for the following achievements:

- 4 Points will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>. Place
- 2 Points will be awarded for 2<sup>nd</sup>. Place
- 1 Point will be awarded for 3<sup>rd</sup>. Place
- 1 Point will be awarded for an Honourable Mention.
- 1 Point will be awarded for winning best first time entry in Novice

Points gained in each year of entry will be added together until the total of 4 points is reached and promotion to next level is then achieved. The Secretary will keep an updated recorded of members and their points which will be published annually at the start of each year.

In addition to the Awards for the Categories above there are special awards for **Best Overall Sequence**; **Best Sound**; **Best Photography** and **Best First Time Entry**, which will be awarded over all categories.

As is always the case where there are fewer entries than the total number of awards the judges will use their discretion on whether to make an award and at what level.

#### **Duration:** No sequence may exceed twelve-minute duration.

<u>Authorship</u>: For all sequences it is expected that the sequence production will be the original work of the entrant(s), (author(s)) and collaborators. "Collaborators need not be Club members, nor affiliated to the I.P.F."

**<u>Copyright & Responsibility:</u>** Entrants using copyright material **must** obtain the necessary licence or permission. Submission of an entry implies the granting of permission for the sequence to be shown in public. Entrants must have a Copyright Performance Licence. Paid up members of the IPF AV Group are included in a group licence and hold an IPF AV Group Copyright performance licence. The **Mechanical-Copyright Protection Society** Ireland Ltd., (**MCPS**) Licence, grants permission to use music and sound only. In accordance with the established music and image copyright regulations, sequences presented at the Championships should be free of all rights of ownership, artistic or otherwise, which others may hold. By participating in the Championships author/s of AV sequences indemnify the organisers against all and any action that may be taken against them by owners of copyrights. The organisers will accept no responsibility in the case of dispute or litigation. All care will be taken in the handling of sequences, but the organisers cannot accept responsibility for loss, theft or damage



**Judging:** One or more qualified person(s) will judge The I.P.F. AV National Championships. They should be well known in Audio-Visual or a similar media. All entries will be shown at the National Championships. Judge(s) are not permitted to be entrants and his/her/their decision/s (*regarding the results of the competition*) is final.

<u>Audience Vote:</u> The audience can vote for their preferred best sequence in both national and International competition. This is independent of the official judging.

**Technical Requirements:** A digital projector, computer (Windows Operating System platform) and sound system will be provided. Entries may be submitted electronically by file transfer protocol (FTP) "WeTransfer.com" or by CD/DVD. All submitted entries shall be self-executable files (exe) named with the Sequences title\*. All sequences should be standalone files and must run with no additional software requirements. Each sequence must run without software promotion slides and in full screen format. The sequence should be programmed with no 'run box', and to return to the desktop at the end. . If a sequence does not meet these requirements then the work will be rejected from the competition. All entries should contain a folder for each slideshow clearly labelled and also include a copy of the entry/identification form. All CD/DVD's should be indelibly labelled. The sequence file and all other material should bear the name of the sequence as printed on the entry/identification form. All sequences will be copied to the Hard Drive for projection at the National Championships **No music credits or Logos** are to appear on the screen. Authors' **names must not appear on sequences (National** 

**Competition Only).** Copied material (sequences) will be archived following the Festival and the CD returned, unless other arrangements have been made with the author. Those not wishing to have their work archived, may apply an expiry date to the file sent or tick the box on entry form re permission to archive. Author's permission will be sought for any showing of archival material for use of promoting AV. The right to grant or refuse permission for showing rests with the named Author.

**Entry Form and Fees:** Every sequence submitted requires a separate Entry Form, forms should be sent together with sequence entry fee to the AV Secretary, **Lilian Webb**, **A.I.P.F.**, 66 Roseville, Naas, Co. Kildare (lilianwebb66@gmail.com); to arrive **not later than 12<sup>th</sup> September 2014**. Cheques made payable to the 'I.P.F. National Treasurer or use the PayPal link ipfavgroup@gmail.com

<u>Sequence material/Identification Sheets</u>: All Identification sheets and sequences should be sent, by electronic transfer to alanpsi@eircom.net or, by post to Alan Lyons, A.I.P.F., Technical Team, 32 Oatfield Avenue, Clondalkin, Dublin 22; to arrive not later than 19<sup>th</sup>. September, 2014.

**<u>Return of Entries:</u>** Every care will be taken in the handling of CD entries but the organisers cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage however caused. Preferably all entries should be collected from the organisers at the end of the Championships. Please enclose return postage if sequences to be returned.

**Distinctions:** Sequences being entered for a distinctions application **may not be entered in the nationals or the All Ireland** competition of the same year. Members of the committee, who are distinction holders, are available for mentoring before applications are made.

Those wishing to apply for a distinction with the Irish Photographic Federation over the National Championships' weekend, need to have the application form, fee etc., in by 12th September, 2014 to the National Distinctions Secretary, Bob Morrison (bobmorrison@eircom.net).

All the above rules re technical requirements also apply. In addition in order to achieve an LIPF, you need no less than 8 minutes of sequences, to achieve AIPF, you need no less than 12 minutes of sequences and for and FIPF, you need no less than 20 minutes of sequences. These can be made up of a number of sequences or one in the case of an LIPF. Those applying for a FIPF and an AIPF, will also need to submit a 150 word statement of intent on their work.
